

Public Education Legislation Passed by the 2022 Legislature & Signed by the Governor

HAFC Sub. for HB 2/a General Appropriations Act (Patricia A. Lundstrom) – Makes general appropriations and authorizes expenditures by state agencies. Provides \$3.87 billion for public education, an additional \$424.9 or 12.3% increase. Includes: 7% average salary increases, minimum hourly wage of \$15 for public employees; higher entry salaries of \$50, \$60 and \$70 thousand for teachers; additional 3% increases for ELPT personnel; additional funding for CTE, At Risk Intervention, Technology Support; Literacy Training and more.

HB 13/a Teacher Residency Changes (Debra Sarinana, Joy Garratt, William Soules, Mimi Stewart) – Expands teacher residency programs to include undergraduates, provides stipends and expands eligibility statewide.

HB 43/a Charter School Facility Improvements (Joy Garrett, Meredith A. Dixon) – Requires notification to charter schools of property available for their educational operations; allows school districts to develop facility prioritization plans; creates a revolving loan fund for charter schools; modifies the terms applicable to grants from the PSCOF for leased facilities; specifies the date by which charter schools must provide information on capital improvement projects proposed for funding through property tax imposition; makes an appropriation.

HB 57/a 2023 Transportation Distribution Calculations (G. Andres Romero) - Adjusts school districts' and charter schools' fiscal year 2023 transportation distribution calculations for effects of the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic on transportation; makes temporary adjustments to transportation distributions.

HB 60/a Native American Language Certificate Salaries (Derrick J. Lente) – Relates to school personnel; requires salary parity for people who hold native American language and culture certificates, makes an appropriation.

HB 73/a Educational Retirees Returning to Work (Joy Garratt) – Creates a new three-year return to work program for retired educators.

HB 119 Adjust Certain School Distributions (G. Andres Romero) – Adjusts amounts to be used in calculating state distributions to school districts that impose a public school capital improvements tax and to charter schools within those school districts; creates an additional distribution to those school districts and charter schools.

SB 1 Increasing Salary for Licensed Teachers (Stewart, Sarinana) – Increases the minimum salaries for Level One, Level Two and Level Three licensed teachers.

SB 36 Contributions to Educational Retirement Fund (Mimi Stewart, Natalie Figueroa) - Increases employer retirement contributions by 2 percent in FY23 and I percent in 2024.

SB 140/aa Opportunity Scholarship Act (Elizabeth "Liz" Stefanics, Joy Garratt) – Expands the option of tuition-free college for New Mexicans pursuing career training certificates, associate's degrees and bachelor's degrees at a New Mexico public or tribal college or university.

SB 212 Capital Outlay Appropriations (Nancy Rodriguez) Authorizes \$827.7 million, from severance tax bond (STB) capacity, general fund and other state funds for the purpose of funding capital outlay projects statewide. Includes \$35 million for specific school capital outlay projects; \$5.0 million for pre-k classrooms; \$5.1 million for school bus purchases; and \$75.0 million for school building maintenance and repair.

MEMORIALS PASSED BY 2022 LEGISLATURE

HM 33 Gifted Education Program Recommendations (Christine Trujillo) – Requests the PED to study and report to the LESC its recommendations for gifted education programs and services.

HM 43 School Mental Wellness Spaces (Pamelya Herndon, Christine Trujillo) – Request the LESC, in collaboration with PED to convene a task force, including committee members and department personnel, mental health care providers, public secondary school teachers, counselors and administrators; school union representatives, community groups, and other interested persons, to develop a comprehensive plan for providing mental wellness spaces in public schools.

HM 48 STEM Career Pipeline Study (Tara L. Lujan) - Requests PED to lead a comprehensive science, technology, engineering and mathematics education-to-career pipeline study, including high-quality professional development for teachers, and report findings and recommendations to the governor and the legislature.

SM 30 Research School Admin Expenditures (Roberto "Bobby" J. Gonzales, Bill Tallman, Harold Pope) – Requests the LFC to research the growth of administrative expenditures by school districts and charter schools and develop proposed legislation to limit that growth.

SM 31 Study Flat School Board Per Diem (Roberto "Bobby" J. Gonzales) - Requests the LESC to study the feasibility of establishing a flat per diem rate of no less than \$95 per meeting for school board member attendance at authorized school board meetings, training and other gatherings.
