New Mexico Data



- In a recent report, published December 1, 2020, from the Learning Policy Institute:
- Students in poverty are experiencing the most dire effects of closed schools.
- 56% of the state's Native households with children under 18 (nearly 15,000 children) lack access to broadband required to make remote learning possible.
- 34% of Native households with children (19,250 children) have no computer.
- More than half of New Mexico households making less than \$25,000 per year (with more than 59,000 children) lack sufficient internet.
- 32% of such households (with more than 34,000 children) are without a computer.
